Sha Kok Mei Temporary Housing Area, Sai Kung (西貢沙角尾臨時房屋區)	Archaeological Investigation conducted from May to June 2007 (four weeks)	Land Sale Residential Development	Sha Ha Archaeological Site was discovered in 1996 and was later investigated in 1998. The large scale rescue operation between 2001 and 2002 yielded considerable archaeological features and finds dated back to the late Neolithic and the Bronze Age periods as well as cultural remains of Han and Ming dynasties.	Field Archaeology Unit of AMO	No cultural remains were recovered from the project area.
2.	Ngau Hom Shek, Yuen Long (元朗牛礮石)	Archaeological Investigation conducted from May to July 2007 (two weeks)	Proposed Mobile Phone Station	The site was first recorded in 1970s. Both the First and Second Territory-wide Surveys revealed that the extent of cultural deposits was not clear due to severe natural erosion. Prehistoric and historic pottery sherds were collected in the vicinity of the project site in 2001.	Field Archaeology Unit of AMO	Most of the project area was disturbed. Few prehistoric pottery sherds were yielded.
3.	Shui Lau Tin Tsuen, Yuen Long (元朗水流田村)	Archaeological Survey in June 2007 (a week)	Small House Development	Cultural remains of Song dynasty were collected by an archaeological survey in 1999.	Field Archaeology Unit of AMO	No cultural deposits could be identified in the development area.
4.	Lung Kwu Tan, Tuen Mun (屯門龍鼓灘)	Archaeological Investigation conducted from May to July 2007 (three weeks)	Electricity Supply Projects	Archaeological significance of the site was confirmed by both the First and Second Territory-wide Surveys. Abundant prehistoric cultural remains were recovered by various rescue operations since 1990s.	Field Archaeology Unit of AMO	The works areas were seriously disturbed. No cultural remains were recovered.

5.	Ma Tseuk Leng San Uk Ha, Sha Tau Kok (沙頭角麻雀嶺新屋下)	Archaeological Survey in September 2007 (a week)	Small House Development	Field investigation in 2000 discovered prehistoric cultural remains and ceramic sherds of Song and Ming periods.	Field Archaeology Unit of AMO	No cultural remains were yielded in the development area.
6.	Former Police Married Quarters Site at Hollywood Road (荷李活道已婚警察宿舍前址)	Site Investigation from March to July 2007	Land Sale Residential Development and Rezoning application	The case was revisited on 6 March 2007. The AMO was recommended to conduct site investigation for a review on the heritage value of the site.	Field Archaeology Unit of AMO	Fieldworks were completed in July 2007.
