# MEMORANDUM FOR MEMBERS OF THE ANTIQUITIES ADVISORY BOARD

# ASSESSMENT OF 1 444 HISTORIC BUILDINGS FINALISATION OF THE GRADINGS OF PROPOSED GRADED BUILDINGS AND RESULTS OF ASSESSMENT OF NEW ITEMS

# **PURPOSE**

This paper invites Members to consider endorsing the gradings / proposed gradings of the historic buildings as detailed in paragraphs 4 to 6 below.

# **BACKGROUND**

- 2. Up to present, Members have endorsed the gradings of 866 historic buildings of the 1 444 including -
  - (a) 154 Grade 1 buildings;
  - (b) 299 Grade 2 buildings; and
  - (c) 413 Grade 3 buildings

Members have also confirmed that 280 buildings do not warrant a grading.

- 3. In addition, Members confirmed that 4 historic buildings of the new items should be accorded with gradings listed below
  - (a) 1 Grade 2 building; and
  - (b) 3 Grade 3 buildings

Members have confirmed after consideration that 1 new item does not warrant a grading.

# MORE ITEMS ON THE 1 444 LIST FOR CONSIDERATION

4. Members are invited to consider the proposed gradings of 8 historic buildings (at <u>Annex A</u>) for which notification letters have successfully reached the owners with either no adverse comment received or queries already addressed.

### NEW ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 5. At the meeting of 22 March 2011, Members accorded 2 new items with proposed gradings at <u>Annex B</u>. After a one-month public consultation, no adverse comment has been received. Members may wish to confirm the gradings of these 2 new items.
- 6. AMO has further completed the research and assessments of the heritage value and grading recommendations of 4 new items (at <u>Annex C</u>). Following the usual practice, subject to Members' views on the recommendations on the gradings of these new items as set out in <u>Annex C</u>, AMO will upload the information and the proposed gradings of the 4 new items to its website for a one-month public consultation. AMO will also write to the owners of the privately-owned items to inform them of the proposed gradings. We will report to Members on any information or views received for further consideration before finalising the gradings of these 4 new items.

### ADVICE SOUGHT

7. Members are invited to consider endorsing the proposed gradings of those items mentioned in paragraphs 4 and 5 above and the preliminary recommendations on the gradings of those new items mentioned in paragraph 6 above.
