

**MEMORANDUM FOR MEMBERS OF THE
ANTIQUITIES ADVISORY BOARD**

ASSESSMENT OF HISTORIC BUILDINGS

PURPOSE

This paper invites Members to consider confirming the grading of the buildings as detailed in paragraph 3 below and to consider the proposed gradings of the buildings set out in paragraphs 4 and 5 below.

BACKGROUND

2. As at the last meeting on 4 December 2013, Members have endorsed the grading of 1 268 buildings as set out below –

- (a) 168 buildings with Grade 1 status;
- (b) 340 buildings with Grade 2 status;
- (c) 458 buildings with Grade 3 status;
- (d) 284 buildings with no grading; and
- (e) 18 buildings which will not be further processed due to their demolition or substantial alteration.

ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION

3. At the meeting held on 4 December 2013, Members accorded proposed grading to a total of 30 new items and started the one-month public consultation. After the consultation period, no adverse comment has been received for 25 items. Members may wish to confirm the grading of these 25 items listed at Annex A.

4. Members also decided at the meeting on 4 December 2013 to defer the discussion of 5 items listed at **Annex B** to the next meeting. These items are now submitted again for Members' consideration of their proposed grading.

5. The Assessment Panel has further completed the heritage assessment and grading recommendations of 3 new items at **Annex C**. Following the usual practice, subject to Members' views, AMO will upload the information and the proposed grading of the new items to the website of AAB for a one-month public consultation. AMO will also write to the owners of the privately-owned items to inform them of the proposed grading. We shall report to Members on any information or views received for further consideration before finalising the grading of these items.

ADVICE SOUGHT

6. Members are invited to consider endorsing the grading of those items as detailed in paragraph 3 above and the proposed grading of those items mentioned in paragraphs 4 and 5 above.
