Fieldwork was conducted from late November to early December 2017. No significant archaeological remains were found from the test pits of the survey.

Archaeological survey for the housing sites in Yuen Long South	It was conducted as part of the EIA to assess the archaeological impact imposed by the development project.	<p>Cloth-impressed tiles of historic period were identified in the archaeological survey. It was recommended in the EIA report to conduct further archaeological survey at the three areas with moderate archaeological potentials to be impacted by development after land resumption.
