PROGRESS REPORT

PURPOSE

This paper briefs Members on the progress of major heritage conservation issues and activities since 1 August 2019.

HISTORIC BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES

Declaration of Monuments

2. The declaration of the rock carving at Cape Collinson, Yuk Hui Temple in Wan Chai and Hau Mei Fung Ancestral Hall in Sheung Shui as monuments under the Antiquities and Monuments Ordinance (Cap. 53) was gazetted on 25 October 2019. The subsidiary legislation to this effect was tabled for negative vetting at the Legislative Council sitting of 30 October 2019.

Preservation of Historic Buildings and Structures

3. The latest position on the preservation of historic buildings and structures monitored by the Board is set out at <u>Annex A</u>.
