Programmes and Activities Organised by CHO

- 7. The programmes and activities organised by CHO include:
 - (a) a roving exhibition as an extended activity to the "Revitalised Historic Buildings Instagram Photo Competition" from August to December 2019, attracting over 123 400 visitors; and
 - (b) "King Yin Lei Public Open Days" at one of the weekends from June to August, and from October to December 2019, attracting about 5 100 visitors.

Educational Programmes Organised by AMO

- 8. Major educational activities organised by AMO include:
 - (a) The "Treasures from Sacred Hill: Song-Yuan Period Archaeological Discoveries from Kai Tak" exhibition, was staged at Hong Kong Heritage Discovery Centre ("HDC") from 24 December 2019 to 26 February 2020;
 - (b) 285 guided tours at various heritage trails, heritage sites, HDC, Ping Shan Tang Clan Gallery and King Yin Lei with a total of over 4 980 participants. Details are set out at **Annex F**; and

(c) 3 lectures/seminars and 19 workshops, with a total of over 790 participants. Details of the lectures/seminars and workshops are at **Annex G**.
