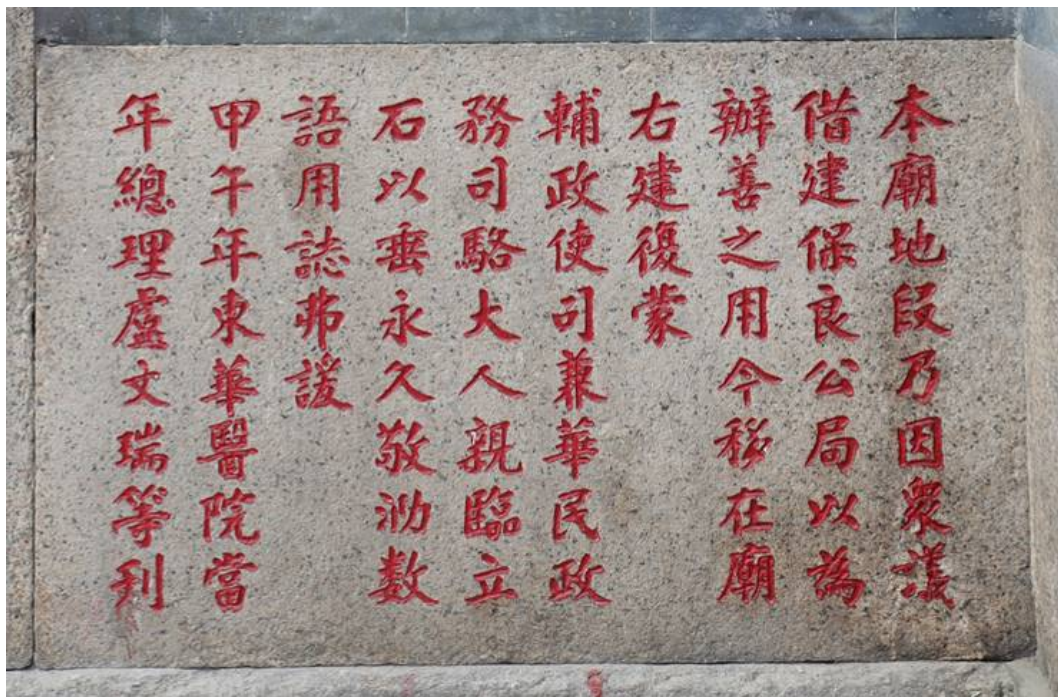


Decorations on main ridges of Kwong Fook Tsz:

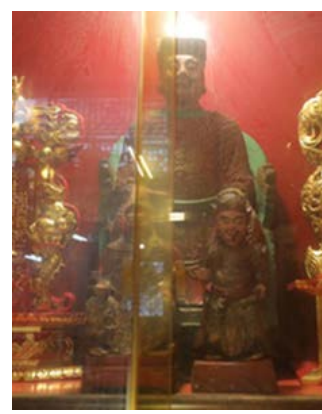
- (1) Shiwan ceramic figurines, a pair of dragon fish and a pair of lions above the entrance hall; and

A granite lintel and a set of granite couplets flank the doorway of the main entrance



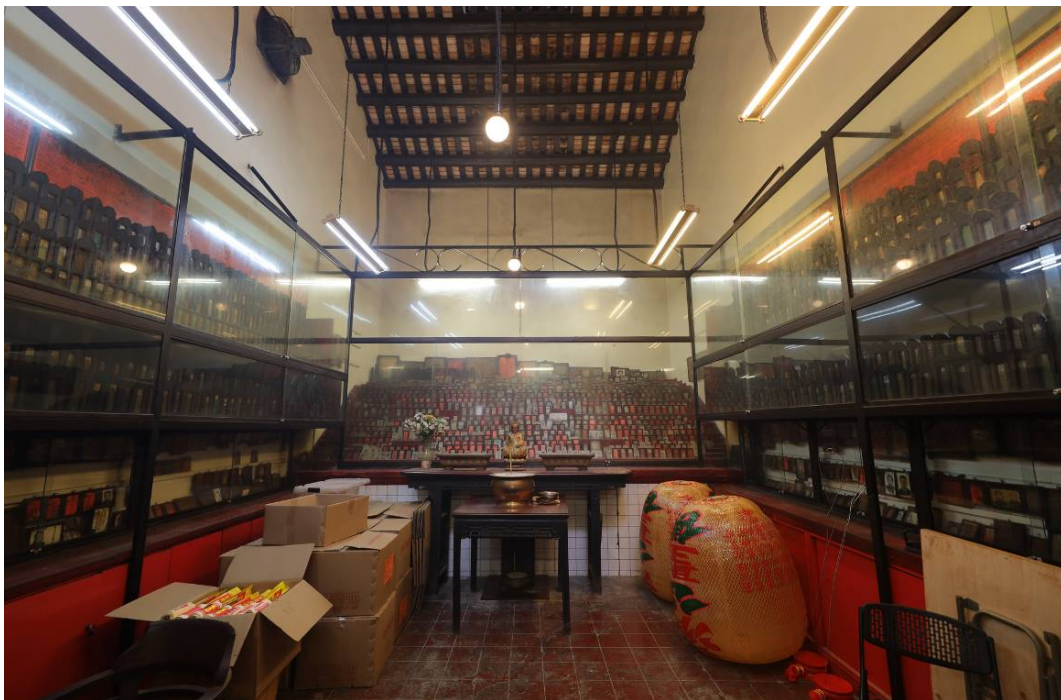
A foundation stone next to the main entrance recording the lending of land to Po Leung Kuk
